Science	N/A	Infused in all sections of the test and reported as a separate "cross-test score"	<p>Tests reasoning, not knowledge, and the ability to interpret tables, graphs, and charts in the context of topics from these fields:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Biology • Physics • Chemistry • Earth/space science <p>Structure:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 6 passages • 40 questions • 35 minutes

In the final analysis ...

Redesigned SAT has 61 fewer questions than ACT & approx 20 seconds more per question (on average) than ACT.
Don't let the extra time fool you: SAT demands closer reading throughout, while ACT is more straightforward.
