

LEVELS OF DISABILITY SUPPORT AT THE COLLEGE LEVEL

COMPLIANCE	MODERATE	COMPREHENSIVE SUPPORT PROGRAM
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide only what is required by the ADA, i.e. “access” to the curriculum • Will offer accommodations such as extended time, permission to record lectures or anonymous note-takers, but don’t offer much else 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vast majority of colleges and universities fall into this category • Accommodations and services will vary from colleges that offer just a little more than compliance colleges and those that offer a wide range of accommodations and services at almost a comprehensive level • In addition to basic accommodations, these schools may offer workshops in study skills and time management, or academic coaches • Typically they will have at least one full-time employee for Disability Services with a background in disability services • Students must be a self-advocate to access accommodations and services • There is usually no fee for these services 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offer a wide variety of accommodations and services • Staff is usually larger and with LD backgrounds • Students required to meet regularly with learning specialists • Typically fee-based • Typically require a separate application • Space can be limited
